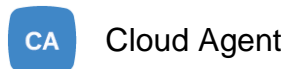


## Qualys Cloud Agent AIX 1.6.2

We're excited to tell you about new features, platform coverage changes, improvements, and bug fixes in the Cloud Agent AIX 1.6.2 release. These updates are specific to the agent binary. Backend, UI, and API updates for new features and fixes of management and reporting capabilities of Cloud Agents are documented in the Cloud Suite release notes.



### New Features

The Cloud Agent AIX 1.6.2 release is the General Availability release for this operating system platform.

## Known Limitations and Workarounds

The following notable known limitations are open in this release:

<b>ID</b>	<b>Description</b>
	<p>The Cloud Agent requires a certificate file of public trusted root certificates to be present on the operating system in order to security communicate with the Qualys Platform. In some cases, public trusted root certificates are not installed by default in AIX installations.</p> <p>The customer is required to add the certificate file and configure appropriately as documented in the Cloud Agent Unix Installation Guide.</p>
	<p>The current version of the Cloud Agent module (in Portal 2.30) has the AIX agent labeled as “beta”, though the agent release is General Availability and officially supported as of Nov 30, 2017.</p> <p>The next release of Portal 2.31 (targeted for early January 2018) will remove the beta label.</p>
